During that time, she gained considerable experience both as a classroom teacher and as a coordinator of various initiatives and projects.

Ms. Sachs-Martin is a stand-out among the teaching staff at East Side Adult Education. Her enthusiasm, her commitment to students, and her advocacy role in the community all came together in the work that she performed. She quickly became a leader within the realm of innovative projects, and brought far more to the instructional setting than a teacher in a standard classroom. She taught a community-based ESL class ("Going to Town"), in which she recruited hard-to-reach students, taught them on a bus as it came to school, and empowered them in the classroom towards self-sufficiency in handling their own community needs. She organized the campus's first recycling program, dealing with many institutional obstacles along the way
